## Scout Sunday

Sunday, February 21<sup>st</sup>. Gulf Breeze United Methodist Church, 9:30am

The Boy Scouts of America annually celebrates its founding on February 8, 1910, based on the program started by Lord Baden Powell in England on August 1, 1907. Scout Sunday was added to the Scout celebration in the middle 1940s.

The Scout Sunday tradition was started to make people in houses of worship aware of Scouting, and to allow Scouts to live out their "Duty to God" pledged each week. The Scout Law says that a "Scout is Reverent" and the Scouts of all ages promise to do their "Duty to God". These values strengthen youth character in their family, community and faith.

Scout Sunday will be observed at Gulf Breeze United Methodist Church on Sunday, Feb. 21<sup>st</sup> during the 9:30am service. Please have your scouts dressed

in their Class A uniforms (no hats) and in the sanctuary by 9:10am to help distribute programs. The scouts will be seated in the first few pews and will be called up during the service to be recognized in front of the congregation. They will then be led to Sunday School. Scouts who have recently completed the God and Country program will have their medals presented to them at this service.

Scouts without a home church are more than welcome to attend GBUMC and be recognized with their fellow pack members.

## Blue and Gold Banquet

Saturday, February 20<sup>th</sup> - GBUMC Fellowship Hall 6:00pm

It is time for our annual Blue and Gold Banquet. The story of the Blue and Gold originates in the depression years of the 1930s. In 1933 "Cub Leaders' Round Table" suggested Parent-Cub dinners. The dads were to bring utensils made of wood and carved, sawed or whittled by the cub and his dad. In the early 1940s the name "Blue and Gold Banquet" started to be used and first appeared in BSA literature. The idea of a Blue and Gold Banquet is a very special reminder about the Cub Scout motto "Do Your Best." Why? Because when times were hard during the depression and when families were separated during a terrible war, everyone did their best for their families to celebrate the accomplishments of young Scouts. We are proud of our Cubs because when things get tough, they always do their best.

This year's banquet theme is "Take Flight into the Second Century of Scouting". Each den will be responsible for making their own placemats and table centerpieces with this theme. The tables sit about 6-8 people.

Den leaders should already have distributed their dens' invitations. The cost for the Blue and Gold banquet is \$7 per person with children 5 and under free.

The cost includes dinner. Please get your money to your den leaders by Feb. 11<sup>th</sup>. Den leaders must turn in the RSVPs and money at the Feb. 11<sup>th</sup> committee meeting. Checks must be made payable to Pack 11.

## USS Alabama Camp-out

Saturday, Feb. 27<sup>th</sup> - Battleship Memorial Park, Mobile, AL

Our pack will be camping out on the USS Alabama docked at Battleship Memorial Park in Mobile, Alabama on Saturday, February 27<sup>th</sup>. This father (father figure)/scout trip is for males only and sorry, no siblings who are not scouts.

Campers must arrive on Saturday, February 27<sup>th</sup> at 5pm. Please leave your camp gear in your vehicle until the entire group boards at 5pm. If you must arrive after 6:30pm please call the battleship at 251-433-2703 or 251-432-5951 to have the gate opened.

Please bring your sleeping bag, food and refreshments, toiletries and flashlight. A USS Alabama employee will conduct an orientation of the park's features and escort our group to the assigned berthing area. The scouts must be supervised by an adult at all times but the ship is open for exploration. There is an 11:00pm curfew that MUST be adhered to. Our group must be packed up and have their gear removed from the ship by 8:00am. You can then be readmitted to the ship if you wish.

The cost for the overnigher is \$18.00 per person with a check made payable to Pack 11. This must be given to your den leader to turn in at the Feb. 11<sup>th</sup> committee meeting. All participants must complete a Hold Harmless Agreement. These forms will be available at the Jan. 28<sup>th</sup> pack meeting.

We are only accepting the first 80 participants so please turn it in early. There will also be USS Alabama patches available for \$3 plus tax, t-shirts for \$8 plus tax and engraved dog tags for \$7.50 plus tax. These must be pre-ordered.
